Take the lead

Safety around cattle: Cattle can act aggressively. Keep yourself and your dog at a safe distance and if necessary unclip the lead and let your dog go so that you can both seek safety.

Farm animals: Never let your dog approach, chase or attack farm animals. Don't take your dog into fields with young farm animals.

Planted fields: Never take your dog into fruit and vegetable fields unless there is a clear path.
